Vaccinations for Children (ages 5 through 11)

(Ministry of Health, Labor and Welfare) Information about third vaccination for children

(5 to 11 years old) <external link>

From 30th September, 2022, Oshu City will be able to provide a 3rd vaccination for children

(5 to 11 years old) for whom five months have elapsed since concluding their second

vaccination.

[Vaccinations for Children]

The proportion of children from the total number of people infected with coronavirus in

Japan is increasing. Both children and their parent(s)/guardian(s) should fully understand

both the advantages (prevention of coronavirus symptom onset or similar) and disadvantages

(vaccination side effects or similar) of coronavirus vaccinations, and consider vaccination

together with the child.

• Persons with doubts or concerns about the vaccinations, such as regarding a child who has

an underlying illness, should consult with their regular doctor.

• Vaccinations will not be given to a child without the consent of the child's parent/guardian.

In addition, parents and guardians are asked to avoid forcing the matter of vaccination upon

other people and contacts, such as those at kindergartens and schools, and to avoid

discriminating against those who have not been vaccinated.

• After receiving a vaccination, people are asked to continue to take preventive measures

against the spread of coronavirus such as gargling, washing hands, and wearing non-woven

masks.

Obligatory effort revealed to also be applicable to pediatric coronavirus vaccinations

As certain scientific findings have been obtained regarding vaccination of children under the

Omicron strain epidemic, it has been deemed appropriate to apply the obligatory effort

provision to children as well. However, as before, the coronavirus vaccination is not compulsory, and there is no change in receiving it on the basis of the judgment of the person or guardian.

## Vaccination target person

**Initial (first and second) vaccinations**: Vaccination includes a total of 2 shots with an interval of 3 weeks between the first and the second shot.

\*If the interval from the first vaccination exceeds 3 weeks, please receive the second vaccination as soon as possible thereafter.

**Booster vaccination:** After completing the initial vaccination round (1st and 2nd shot), receive the 3rd vaccination shot at least 5 months later.

#### Vaccine to be used

- · A pediatric version of the coronavirus vaccine manufactured by Pfizer.
- \* If a person who was 11 years old at the time of the first vaccination turns 12 years old by the date of the second vaccination, the second vaccination type must match the type used in the first vaccination.
- \*Those who were 11 years old at the time of the second vaccination and turned 12 years old by the date of the third "booster" vaccination must be vaccinated with the same Omicron strain bivalent vaccine as adults.

### Postal distribution of vaccination tickets

**Initial (first) vaccination:** For children who are turning 5 years old(until 31st March, 2023), vaccination tickets will be sent around the end of the calendar month that comes prior to the child's month of birth.


